

# Roses for Hot, Dry Climates

**Species and Old Garden Roses:** Species, or wild roses, usually have from 4 to 8 petals, bloom once a year, and grow from 2 to 20 feet tall. Old Garden Roses are those that existed prior to 1867, the year the first hybrid tea rose was introduced. There are many classes of this rose that vary in height from 2 to 20 feet in a variety of colors, with flower forms that are quartered, cupped, expanded, reflexed, globular, or compact. While many only have one bloom set a year, it can be quite a long session. Their colorful hips can be a magnificent display and their heady fragrance unforgettable. Use them in fragrance gardens and arrangements, or as borders, hedges, or climbing walls, arbors, and pergolas.
